What is a difference maker? Someone who is committed and purposeful about the relationships that they make and the decisions they make.

¹⁴ "You are the light of the world—like a city on a hilltop that cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ No one lights a lamp and then puts it under a basket. Instead, a lamp is placed on a stand, where it gives light to everyone in the house." Matthew 5:14-15 NLT

Some common traits of difference makers:

- Difference makers are driven by a deep sense of purpose.
- Difference makers instinctively know how to get things done.
- Difference makers possess exceptional <u>empathy</u> and <u>compassion</u>.
- Difference makers are not content with simply talking about change; they take action.
- Difference makers understand the power of collaboration.

CAN ONE PERSON MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

- 1. Take action.
- 2. Do not encourage or join in the bullying.
- 3. Encourage your friends to stand up for them as well.

- 4. Do something.
- 5. Talk to the individual.
- 6. Be <u>a friend</u>.
- 7. Encourage the victim to get help.
- 8. Report the abuse.
