Honoring Your Parents

The first four commandments prepare us to <u>live out</u> the final six commandments.

Honor your father and mother. Then you will live a long, full life in the land the Lord your God is giving you. **Exodus 20:12 NLT**

² "Honor your father and mother." This is the first commandment with a promise: ³ If you honor your father and mother, "things will go well for you, and you will have a long life on the earth." **Ephesians 6:2-3 NLT**

Honor: time (tim-may'); to value, respect, or highly esteem; to treat as precious, weighty or valuable.

We <u>commonly</u> use the things in our life we don't view as <u>valuable</u>.

Why did God include this in the Ten Commandments?

- Every parent is human.
- God used their DNA to make you unique.

..."God knit me together in my mother's womb . . . and recorded every day of my life before I was born." **Psalm 139:13,16 NLT**

As a child I honor my parents by <u>obeying</u> them.

Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord. Colossians 3:20 ESV

As a parent I gain my children's honor by living a life worthy of respect.

• Lead them.

Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it. **Proverbs 22:6 ESV**

• Encourage them.

Wise words satisfy like a good meal; the right words bring satisfaction. **Proverbs 18:20 NLT**

• Discipline them.

Those who spare the rod of discipline hate their children. Those who love their children care enough to discipline them. **Proverbs 13:24 NLT**

As an adult I honor my parents by treating them as <u>valuable</u>.

- Look beyond the role and see the person.
- Seek their <u>advice</u> when making <u>decisions</u>.

A wise son heeds his father's instruction, but a mocker does not respond to rebukes. **Proverbs 13:1 NIV**

Listen to your father, who gave you life, and don't despise your mother when she is old. **Proverbs 23:22 NIV**

• Forgive them.

Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others. **Colossians 3:13 NLT**

Honoring your parents teaches you to honor your God.
