This year, we have witnessed God move in powerful ways—changing lives, stirring hearts, and building His church. We have seen decisions made for Christ, believers baptisms, discipleship through mentoring and Life Groups, and people stepping up to serve Jesus by serving others. Only God could do what is happening here, and we give Him all the glory! This year brought incredible Kingdom impact. Over 200 decisions for Christ, 90 baptisms, growth and community through 48 Life Groups, 51 new mentors trained, and more than 200 Dream Team members serving faithfully each week. Our young adults completed five local mission projects, 185 kids encountered Jesus at One Big Week, Celebrate Recovery impacted lives on our campus and inside local jails where lives are being transformed, and we sent two mission teams to Livingston, Montana, to support church-planting efforts and share the hope of Jesus beyond our city.

As you look through this booklet, I pray that you see more than numbers and events—I pray you see stories of life change, real people that God loves and Jesus has redeemed. Every decision, every baptism, and every act of service represents someone experiencing the transforming grace of God. The Sunday that Changed Everything

Pam Bradley found faith, family, and a fresh start.

Born and raised in Chicago, Illinois, Pam Bradley always knew about God but never felt fully committed to Him. Four years ago, after moving to Prattville, she worked hard to provide for herself and her family. She remembers passing Journey Church almost every day for nearly two years—until one Sunday, a little over a year ago, she decided to stop in for a visit.

I immediately felt like this was “home and wanted to be a part of this family.”

That day, Pam sat in service and felt like the message was meant just for her. “Pastor Mike was speaking about how other things can become our ‘god,’ and I realized, right then, that my job had become mine.”

Not long before that, Pam had faced a sudden medical crisis that forced her out of work. During that season, she discovered how much she had relied on her own strength and ability to provide. But now, with nothing else to depend on, she had to

trust God fully—and she saw His faithfulness in a powerful way. “I never lacked and often felt like I had more than enough when I was working so God used that time as a personal time with me.”

These realizations led Pam to raise her hand for salvation that same day. “I surrendered my life to Christ.” After service, she went to the VIP Room for prayer and to learn more about baptism. “I wanted to do it right. I wanted to follow Jesus!” Two weeks later, Pam came to church ready and excited to be baptized. “I wasn’t scared or nervous—I just wanted to do it!” Afterward, she

felt an overwhelming sense of peace and relief, knowing who she is in Christ and that her old life was behind her.

Today, you can find Pam serving faithfully on the Connection Team—greeting guests with a smile and helping people find their place at Journey. Her story is a shining testimony of what God can do when we surrender everything to Him.

The Power of Mentorship

How God used community to reignite Laura Miller's faith.

Laura Miller grew up in church and accepted Christ at a young age. But it wasn't until her teenage years being surrounded by a vibrant youth group and a passionate youth pastor that she began to truly understand Christ's love for her. Those years helped shape her faith and gave her confidence to lead others to Christ, even though she didn't yet understand what discipleship meant.

College and adulthood brought a different season. Moving away from her church community left Laura spiritually adrift, and in the busyness of marriage and motherhood, her faith grew quiet. "I knew God was there," she says, "but I often felt distant and unsure how to get back."

About four years ago, when her husband began traveling for work, isolation set in deeply. Yet even in that loneliness, Laura sensed God calling her back into community. "He kept nudging me," she remembers. "It was time to take a step." Eventually, she joined a Life Group—and that single act of obedience changed everything.

Through her group, Laura was invited into a mentorship program and paired with an incredible

woman of God. Together, they dug into Scripture and discovered how God's love and purpose meet in everyday life. "Even though I'd heard many of those lessons before," Laura says, "they came alive in a new way. It was exactly what my heart needed."

What began as a mentoring relationship became a deep friendship and sisterhood in Christ. It reignited Laura's passion for discipleship and renewed her purpose.

Called to Go

Ryan Taylor's story of surrender, growth, and following God into a new chapter of ministry.

In July 2021, Ryan Taylor hit rock bottom. "I had been saved since I was 15, but I never truly walked with God. I didn't have anyone to disciple me, and I found myself far from where I needed to be." After a difficult week, Ryan pulled up an old Journey Church sermon from Pastor Mike on surrender. Though recorded a year earlier, it was exactly what he needed.

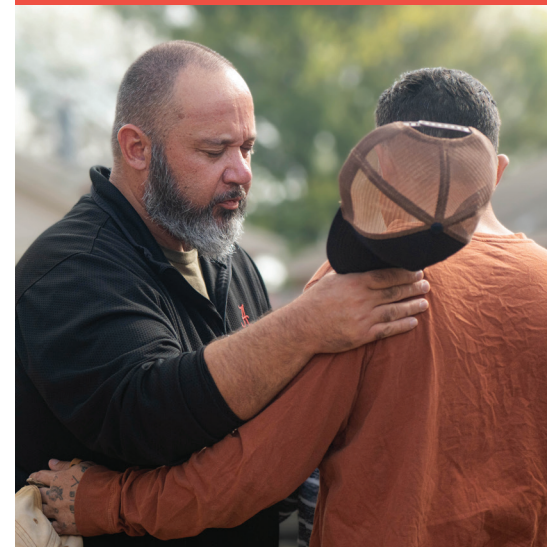


"I immediately texted Mike, 'I surrender.'" The next day, they met to talk about salvation, new beginnings, and discipleship. Ryan began attending a men's Bible study on Wednesdays and weekly Sunday morning services at Journey.

About six months later, Ryan launched a New Believers Life Group to help others grow in their faith, offering the same support he had once needed. "Serving at Journey taught me it's not about recognition or titles — it's about Jesus. He calls us to serve and show His love to others. God's forgiveness isn't ours to keep; it's meant to be shared."

In August 2025, Ryan sensed God calling him to something new. "The Lord began stirring my heart to go and make more disciples, though I didn't yet know where." Around that time, Lifeline Church reached out to Pastor Mike about potential candidates. Ryan met with their lead pastor and he knew God was leading him there.

Now serving as the Associate Pastor at Lifeline Church, Ryan sees every day as another opportunity to live out what God began in him at Journey. Ryan shares, "Leaving was difficult, but obedience matters more than comfort." What he found on the other side was a deeper joy—people to love, lives to serve, and a place where his Journey-shaped faith could take root and grow. In his words, "It's all about Jesus." And the way he continues to lead, serve, and love others proves it.

On Sunday, September 28, 2025, Journey Church experienced a powerful move of God. One that none of us could have scripted, yet all of us had been praying toward. What began as a normal Sunday quickly became a holy moment as **spontaneous baptisms** broke out across all three services. By the end of the day, 22 people stepped into the waters, declaring Jesus as Lord. It was a day marked by joy, tears, worship, and the unmistakable presence of the Holy Spirit.

What made the moment feel even more significant was the preparation that happened long before the first person ever stood up. In the weeks leading up to that Sunday, our team felt a stirring—an expectation that God wanted to do something deeper in our church family. Staff and leaders prepared spiritually to ask God to awaken hearts. We prayed over every seat in the room. We prayed for boldness. We prayed that people would hear the voice of God clearly. We prepared physically too: towels, shirts, and volunteers ready at a moment's notice.



When the invitation was given, the response was immediate. People got up from their seats to go be baptized! What a sight! Some with tears, some with relief, all with courage. Families celebrated together. Friends stood by each other. Stories were rewritten in real time, and with every baptism, the room erupted in praise, as if heaven itself was cheering with us.

It was a Sunday we will always remember. Not because of the numbers, but because of the unmistakable reminder that God is still drawing people to Himself. September 28, 2025, will always stand as a milestone in Journey's story—a day when preparation met God's power, and lives were transformed forever.

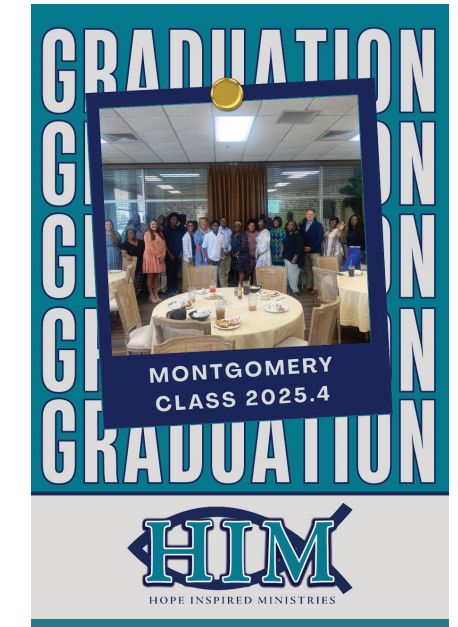

Fallapalooza to the Frontier

Madison Harris stepped out in faith, and God met her in Montana.

For as long as I can remember, my parents have been involved in ministry. When I was about ten, their calling shifted from serving on church staff to serving as U.S. missionaries. So when it came to missions, the idea wasn't new to me. But when Pastor Bill asked me at the 2024 Fallapalooza if I wanted to join the Montana missions trip team, I laughed and told him that if my parents agreed, I'd go. I had been on missions trips before, but this would be the first time I chose to go on my own.

My parents were nervous about sending me without them, but a week later my mom took me to the interest meeting after service. I'd been to Montana once before when my family helped a church, but I was still surprised by what I heard. Only about ten percent of the people in Montana identify as Christian. Growing up in the "Bible Belt," I couldn't imagine living in a place with so few churches or so little generational faith. Hearing that, I realized how deep the spiritual need was and I knew it was time to put my faith into action.

So I took the next step and signed up for the May trip!

A few months later, I found myself serving in Livingston, Montana. One day Pastor Steve taught me how to paint ceilings as we prepared a missions house—I ended up covered in paint. Another day, I wore a bright orange vest to help vendors set up booths and direct traffic at a farmers market. Our team served the community, worked with the cowboy church, and attended Expedition Church's Sunday service. My favorite part was talking with people and pointing them back toward the church encouraging them to go to Expedition.

Looking back, I'm grateful for the Big Give and its role in making this trip possible. When we think about missions, we often picture faraway places like Africa or India, but our own country needs Jesus too. I went to Montana to grow in my faith and discover my heart for missions beyond my family's calling—and I came home changed and thankful for what God is doing in me.

Feeding the Schools

How simple food brought connection and transformation.

Three years ago, when Pastor Darryl began at Journey Church, a new vision took root; one that reached far beyond the church walls and straight into the heart of local schools. What started with feeding athletes has now turned into connecting, encouraging, and helping transform students, coaches, and staff alike.

Journey Church discovered an opportunity to serve where traditional outreach couldn't go. "In public schools, religion isn't allowed in the classroom," Pastor Darryl explains, "but through extracurricular programs, we found an open door."

So the church started showing up — setting tables, serving meals, and sharing moments of prayer. What began as pre-game meals soon became something much deeper. "We realized the most direct way to reach the schools was to feed the students," Darryl says. "We'd meet with coaches, talk with players, and pour into students' lives. Our heart goes far beyond the field."

The impact has been undeniable. Coaches have

seen changes in conduct, motivation, and grades. Players are finding unity across backgrounds and forming teams built on character and connection. "It's not just about Friday night wins," Darryl says, "It's about helping students see that winning starts with who they are off the field, and pointing them to Jesus."

When the Journey team arrives, it's more than a meal. It's greetings, handshakes, and hugs. Each gathering includes a short devotion about mindset and purpose, ending with a powerful moment of prayer that points hearts toward God.

In 2025, Darryl became the official Chaplain and Spiritual Adviser for Prattville High School Athletics, partnering with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to lead early-morning devotionals. Journey now serves every sport, from golf to flag football, reminding students they are seen, valued, and loved by God.

Pastor Darryl reminds us, "At Journey Church, every win they have is a win we have," He continues, "When we serve, give, and show love, we're part of their success story — one meal, one prayer, one heart at a time."



Impact

This is what impact looks like. Ordinary people saying yes to an extraordinary God. Each story is proof that when we surrender our plans to His purpose, lives change.

The impact of Journey Church is more than moments we celebrate; it's the movement of God's love through us, every single day.

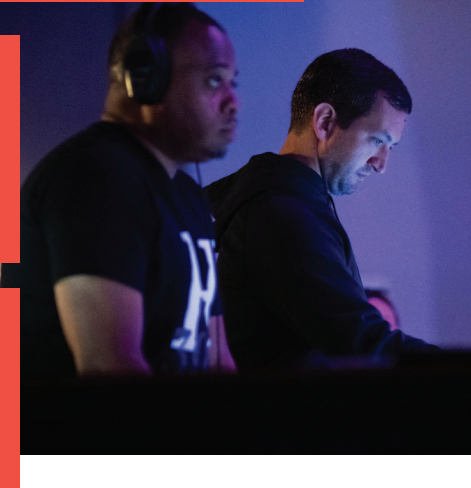
