



Sermon Based Discussion Questions: Kingdom Values Week 2

1. In what ways do you see moral and spiritual decay in your community or society?
2. Jesus calls us the "salt of the earth." Are there areas in your life where you've blended in with the culture instead of standing out as a preserving influence for Christ? What needs to change?
3. How might your prayer life play a role in preserving the spiritual health of your family, workplace, or neighborhood?
4. Serving others can push back against selfishness in our society. What is one practical way you can serve regularly that would help slow spiritual decay around you?
5. Standing firm on God's truth can be difficult, especially when culture pushes against it. Discuss a time when you felt regret for hesitating to speak or act on Biblical truth.
6. Where do you see Christians—including yourself—at risk of losing their "saltiness" by compromising with the world?
7. Jesus asks us to let our good deeds shine for God's glory. Discuss a more intentional action you can take to challenge the negative patterns you see in society and point others toward hope in Christ?
8. Being the church means more than just attending services. In what ways can you—and your church community—actively resist moral decline and bring positive change where God has placed you?
9. Jesus will return for His Church. How does that future hope motivate you to live differently today to slow the moral and spiritual decay you see around you?
